

The programme aims to develop the clinical academic research leaders of the future - with the potential to become independent researchers and lead their own research projects. Click on link:



#### NIHR's Strategic Review of Training




As part of the changes being taken forward following NIHR's Strategic Review of Training and feedback to both HEE and NIHR, a bridging scheme is being introduced to support individuals in ICA eligible professions who have completed or are about to complete a PhD and who are looking to undertake a postdoctoral level fellowship such as the ICA Clinical Lectureship.

#### About the Bridging Schemes

Bridging schemes are a way of providing support to clinical academics to build on their previous academic training and develop proposals for a pre or post-doctoral award, and take the next step on their clinical academic pathway.

# ICA Programme Bridging Scheme falls within the new pathway:



## Aims of ICA Bridging Scheme at UoK



- Enable awardees to develop skills in higher-level reflection in relation to research based upon their discipline.
- □ Provide academic supervision and facilitate clinical mentorship to awardees to undertake research that builds upon a culture of critical evaluation and enquiry in relation to their health services setting.
- □ Develop opportunity for selfdirected research and reflection.

- Immerse pre-doctoral awardees into a research environment and enable them to develop an independent piece of research in preparation for a PhD application
- Consolidate post-doctoral awardees academic training and development whilst supporting them in balancing their clinical service, and assisting them with developing an application for the Clinical Lectureship or Senior Clinical Lectureship


