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

#### **Artist Statement**

As an artist, I explore and generate the *photograph* as an art medium that continually explores how personal interactions with our world are re-lived as moments of one's visual subjectivity in a constantly changing and transitory world, documented in photographic imagery. I explore a vast array of conceptual photographic imagery, techniques and digital interactions that express how the conceptual possibilities of narrative expectations are embedded in the still photograph. To this creative end, I generate photographic work where one predominant inventive interrogation is repeatedly present: if the photograph gives us such a unique ability to revisit the chronology of our lives, then, essentially, **the photograph** is the optical echo of our subjectivity, that, irresistibly and tirelessly, underpins our relentless determination to understand the pictures we hold up as mirrors of our existential reality.

### Biography

Ken Giles is a photographic artist and essayist with a Bachelor of Applied Arts from Ryerson University, a Master of Fine Arts from the University of Michigan, and a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Kent at Canterbury, United Kingdom. His photographic work has been included in solo and group exhibitions spanning Australia, England, Germany, Belgium, France, the U.S.A and across Canada. Previous conceptual photographic work, including his 2007-2011 chrono-photographic imagery, has been presented at the Art Gallery of Windsor and The Academy of Performing Arts, Hong Kong in 2012. Over the last five years, the bulk of his work has appeared in Ann Arbor at the Stamps Gallery, University of Michigan in the Annual Alumni Exhibition, 2016, 2017, while in 2013 and 2014 a photographic project, 49 Degrees Latitude, utilizing GPS positioning along the 49° latitude, was exhibited at the former Work Detroit Gallery, University of Michigan Center, Detroit. In 2016 his Gravity and Zero Gravity portraits were exhibited at the former Jean Paul Slusser Gallery at the University of Michigan, while the longstanding and ongoing project Glove was exhibited in The Story of Things exhibition at SB Contemporary Art, Windsor.

Ken's writing has been printed for Canadian artists such as Iain Baxter& ("Lived Experience: Walking-A Contemplative Time Frame" 2013) and several national and international catalogue essays for Amin Rehman, that include "History Begins With Us", for the Zahoo-ul-Akhlag Gallery, National College of Arts, Lahore Pakistan in 2015; "I Reiterate: A is For..., A is For...", for Artcite, Windsor and the McIntosh Gallery, London in 2013; and "Palimpsest: a messy state of affairs", for the Art Gallery of Mississauga in 2011. Other writing endeavors have included the exhibition essay for Dan Bernyk's Thames Art Gallery work "Shift" in 2009, and the catalogue for the Green Corridor Art Initiative, "Open Corridor" in 2010.
